TROY HIGH SCHOOL: 63.3 \%
ATHENS HIGH SCHOOL: 42.2\%

- Significant increases in the last three years
- Among the highest in the state and nation

## What does it mean?

- A Focus School is one where the gap between the top $30 \%$ and the bottom $30 \%$ is among the top $10 \%$ in the state.
- Does NOT mean a school is low performing


## What are we doing?

- Testing to identify gaps in learning for all students
- Providing intensive and focused support and intervention for students who need it
- Using assessments to direct our instruction and fill those gaps
- Individualizing instructional strategies so that performance improves for students at all levels
- Offering after-school tutoring for Title 1 students
- Offering evening meetings to provide strategies for parents to support their children



## State Funding

- Funding levels permanently cut last year
- Funding level 2010-11: \$9275 per student
- Funding level 2011-12: $\$ 8805$ per student
- Funding level 2012-13: $\$ 8805$ per student
- Reduction of $\$ 8.7$ million per year


## State Funding

- Funding reforms in limbo because of court challenges
- TSD will be responsible for $\$ 600,000+$ in additional retirement costs


## Funding Uncertainty

- Personal Property Tax Elimination
- TSD can recoup \$52 per pupil for the 2012-2013 school year ONLY if we meet 7 out of 8 Best Practices


## Actions Taken to Address Financial Issues

- $\$ 62.9$ million cumulative adjustments 2002/032011/12
- Adjustments - $\$ 41.9$ million
- Fund Equity - $\$ 21.1$ million

Most recent reductions:

- 2009-2010 expenditure adjustments of $\$ 7.6$ million
- 2010-2011 expenditure adjustments of $\$ 6.2$ million
- 2011-2012 expenditure adjustments of $\$ 4.1$ million


## Proposed Legislation

- Seat Time Waivers (HB 5392)
- New Forms of Schools (HB 5923)
- Adds new online and charter schools with no accountability
- Allows "new schools" to discriminate based on academic achievement


## Status Update

- Full-Day Kindergarten Funding Change Beginning 2012-2013
- Website Redesign
- Facilities Study
- Technology Study
